One of the greatest joys I have as president of KMBC is to see our students get victory over sin- yes, even their besetting sins. It is exciting to see the great change that comes to their lives when through the power of the Holy Spirit; they are able to get victory over sin! This week I met the parents of one of our students. With smiling faces they told me, "We have seen a big change in our daughter sine she came to KMBC!" At KMBC we do not present a savior who will help them with sin management. Instead, we present a Savior who can deliver them from all sin!!

INSULATING ATTICS

This winter, our maintenance crew was busy insulating the attics of 18 of our campus buildings. Our attics had been insulated previously but were not well insulated. A generous donor gave the college a semi-load of high quality fiber glass insulation delivered to our door. The donor also provided a commercial blower to install it free of charge. Our only cost was the labor and gasoline to run the machine. Our attics now have more than twice the insulation. This will help reduce heating bills in the winter and cooling bills in the summer. The college is very grateful for this generous donation of insulation which will save energy dollars as long as these buildings stand.


FIFTY NINE AND COUNTING

This couple will be sorely missed on this campus and community, but will surely bring the light of God to bear wherever they go. Please pray that God will continue to anoint them for service and love.




Each summer KMBC hosts a youth camp in conjunction with the Mt. Carmel Campmeeting. The dates of this year's youth camp are July 25-29. Our youth evangelist is Rev. David Cooper from Deford, Michigan. David and his wife Trisha both graduated from KMBC. David is an excellent youth speaker who knows how to challenge youth to go deeper with God.

KMBC is putting a lot of resources into making this camp one of the best in the country. Last year, we had 100 campers. Several things that make this camp unique and outstanding are the following:

- Due to our location, the students can go canoeing, hiking in mountains and other novel recreational activities that are not available in most camps
- The college facilities are air conditioned and more modern than many rustic camp grounds.
- The college hand picks camp workers who are trained and spiritually qualified, which results in a more spiritually focused program.
- Because the college underwrites much of the expense, we can charge \$100 for a program that would cost \$250 or more somewhere else.
