



HOW DO I APPLY?

Applicants must present credentials which indicate that they meet criteria of character, conduct, and aptitude for the academic work they will attempt. In assessing the applicant's suitability for admission, the Admissions/Retention Committee expects the following:

Check each box as you complete the task.

- 1. The Application for Admission completely filled out and signed.
- 2. A \$25 non-refundable application fee or an official campus visit.
- 3. One or two paragraphs about yourself, including Christian experiences, your life goals, and why you have chosen to attend Kentucky Mountain Bible College.
 - a. The applicant should know the Lord Jesus Christ as personal Savior or be earnestly seeking to be saved.
 - b. The applicant should be in accord with the scriptural teaching that sanctification is an instantaneous work of God by which believers are cleansed from original sin and brought into a state of complete devotion to God.
 - c. The applicant should be willing to place himself/herself under disciplines which help prepare him/her for effective Christian Service.
- 4. A Transcript of graduation from high school.
 - a. An applicant with a GED (General Education Diploma) will be admitted on Provisional Admission for his/her first semester. If the student earns a C average or above, he/she will be removed from provisional status.
 - b. Home-schooled students who have not completed a traditional high school education may be considered for admission by submitting documentation of comparable high school curriculum. A sample transcript is available upon request.
- 5. Two favorable recommendations from either a pastor, an educator, or an adult who knows you well. We ask that none of the referents be related to you.
- 6. Applicants under the age of 25 are required to take the American College Test (ACT). School Code - 1515
- 7. If applicable, transcripts of all scholastic work beyond high school.

Following acceptance, and prior to enrollment, the student is asked to provide medical information and a small, recent picture.
