

EARLY APPLICATION PROCEDURE

You don't have to wait till your senior year to be accepted! Kentucky Mountain Bible College offers provisional acceptance! Apply online at www.kmbc.edu/apply

KMBC accepts applicants as early as the second semester of their Junior year of High School.

To pursue early acceptance, here is what we need:

- 1. The Application for Admission filled out and signed.
- 2. \$25.00 non-refundable application fee or an official campus visit.
- 3. One or two paragraphs about yourself, including Christian experiences, your life goals, and why you have chosen to attend Kentucky Mountain Bible College.
 - The applicant should know the Lord Jesus Christ as personal Savior or be earnestly seeking to be saved.
 - The applicant should be in accord with the scriptural teaching that sanctification is an instantaneous work of God by which believers are cleansed from original sin and brought into a state of complete devotion to God.
 - The applicant should be willing to place himself/herself under disciplines which help prepare him/her for effective Christian service.
- 4. Partial high school transcript, including all courses completed at time of submission.
 - Home-schooled students who have not completed a traditional high school education may be considered for admission by submitting documentation of completion of a comparable high school curriculum. A sample transcript is available upon request.
- 5. Two favorable recommendations from either a pastor, an educator or an adult who knows you well. We ask that none of the referents be related to you.
- 6. Your scores on the ACT, SAT, or CLT. (If available)

Notes:

An early acceptance offer is valid for two years, giving ample time to complete High School.

To maintain acceptance and be eligible for admission to KMBC, the student must:

- Graduate from High School
- Maintain a similar or higher GPA. A significant GPA reduction may result in a loss of acceptance.
- Submit a complete High School Transcript when available
- Submit acceptable scores on the ACT, SAT, or CLT.
